## Status of muscularis propria (Required)

The presence or absence of muscularis propria is a vital piece of information in determining the adequacy of a biopsy or transurethral resection (TUR) specimen that contains an invasive carcinoma.<sup>1-3</sup> For such patients, the absence of muscularis propria in a transurethral resection of bladder tumour (TURBT) would be an indication for a repeat TUR to be performed if treatment is other than cystectomy. It is well documented that absence of muscularis propria in a TURBT specimen is associated with a significantly increased risk of residual disease and early recurrence.<sup>4</sup> The current European Association of Urology (EAU) guidelines recommend repeat TUR (i) after an incomplete initial TUR, (ii) if there is no muscle in the specimen after initial resection with the exception of Ta, LG/G1 tumours and primary carcinoma in situ (CIS), (iii) in all T1 tumours and (iv) in all HG/G3 tumours except primary CIS.<sup>3</sup> It generally is also considered appropriate to comment on the presence or absence of muscularis propria in a biopsy or TUR specimen, irrespective of the presence or absence of muscularis propria in a biopsy or TUR specimen, irrespective of the presence or absence of invasive carcinoma.
